1. Author(s) of Paper

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2. Purpose of Paper

To inform the Board of HAI Report with regard to compliance with Hand Hygiene and Cleaning Specifications within SNBTS (October to December 2009).

3. Key Issues

SNBTS HAI Reporting Template

- This is the fourth SNBTS HAI Reporting Template providing information on compliance with Hand Hygiene and Cleaning Specifications.
- **National data** - The National Hand Hygiene Campaign Compliance with Hand Hygiene Audit Report for December 2009 reported an overall result for hand hygiene compliance of 92% (21st September to 3rd October 2009). Compliance percentages within NHS Boards ranged from 85% to 99%.
- **SNBTS data** - SNBTS hand hygiene compliance score for October was 96%, November 98% and December 99%. Compliance percentages ranged from 93%-100% with a total of 790 opportunities being observed.
- Benchmarking shows that SNBTS data is slightly above the national average however, there are no confidence intervals for this data therefore at present we are uncertain whether this is of statistical significance.

Please note that although SNBTS data is reported to SGHD it is not part of the National Hand Hygiene Campaign Data due to the variances in healthcare provision and therefore NSS'S ability to capture the national data set.

Cleaning Monitoring

The HAIR reporting template indicates that the Mobile Donating Centre achieved a score of 89% which was due to the Glasgow donating centres being monitored individually. The maximum score achievable on a bus is 36 (100%). If any one area fails, this reduces the score to 32 (89%) requiring a re-monitor. The re-monitor achieved the required 100%. This has been brought to the attention of Health Facilities Scotland.

Indications are that the Cleanliness Monitoring Report for the quarter October – December will be 97%.

SK52 ODG only gained 89% in November this was due to low level dust in 1 small area. The bus was re-monitored at 100%. This has highlighted that it is only possible for Mobile Donating Centres to pass at 100% or achieve less than 90% if any 1 area fails. I have brought this to the attention of Richard McManus HFS.

The results from Beatson, Aberdeen donor Centre, Dundee Donor Centre and Edinburgh New Royal are not reportable by NHS NSS these figures are currently included in the specific Board result.

It is anticipated that the quarterly score October to December, reportable to the Government will be around 97%
